This year has already been exceptionally positive for the Tibetan Children's Education Foundation. Thanks to so many of you, we entered the first weekend of 2023, having had a successful yearly fundraiser in November. We were able to act upon one of the essential tenets of TCEF's mission; sharing Tibetan culture through a visit by Venerable Lobsang Samten and Karma Tensum to my yoga studio in Los Gatos, California. So much was learned and shared!

Because of you, this year, we have already been able to expand our giving to more Tibetan elders living in India.

Now we're turning our attention to growing our reach by potentially supporting two schools in the remote region of Ladakh, India. We invite you to join us in Ladakh this August (while you do need to be in good health, you do not need to practice yoga to attend). We'll visit Tibetan monasteries, learn from Karma, and explore how best to support two schools in the Zanskar region; one is the Rainbow School, founded by a student who graduated from Kyitsel-ling. The circle of education continues.

We are also turning our attention this year to appealing for more college sponsorships. Many of our students will graduate from high school in the coming years. Supporting them as fully as possible means providing college education when students are eligible. Would you like to support a college student?

We also want to grow the Accelerated English Learning project. Having traveled to many locations where students benefit from knowing English, I hope to connect with a few schools worldwide. Imagine children at a school in Kenya and our Tibetan students able to share their experiences through Zoom, for example.

And do you know that Kyitsel-ling Tibetan Children's Education Center - TCEF's key partner, just celebrated 25 years? This is because of Karma Tensum, who has lived his mission in every way and inspired us through his dedication and presence. It is also worth mentioning India Supera, who we share as our mentor. She said years ago these words: "You are part of our mission to make an impact on the lives of many Tibetans. I appreciate that you care about supporting the future of Tibetans in Exile." Those words continue to be true. Thank you for your continued enthusiasm and dedication to all Tibetans.

HOW ENGLISH PROFICIENCY CAN HELP TIBET AND TIBETAN STUDENTS

In trying to help Tibetan education in exile, a question I ask myself often is - how can we make a REAL difference for the children? What will make help them the most in life?

I'm not sure I have all the answers, but, based on my own life, some amount of proficiency in English can really help. I write this with conviction. I know my own early education at Wynberg Allen School changed my life completely - but when I think about it deeply - more than anything else, it was the English proficiency that made all the difference for me.

In India the value of being fluent or even reasonably fluent in English is huge. This is primarily the reason why parents in India pay huge sums of money to send their children to English medium private schools. What is true for Indian students is equally true for Tibetan students in exile in India.

Yes, it is true that the medium of instruction in most Tibetan schools at the primary level is Tibetan. But at the middle and high school levels, the medium of instruction is English. Fluency in English impacts one's ability to both understand and master other subjects. If your English is weak, you are at a huge disadvantage because all other subjects are taught and examined in English. More importantly, after school, whether it be admission to good colleges or employment, English proficiency can play a huge role.

If we are truly hoping to make a difference for the children in our lives - the sponsored children and the children at Kyitsel-ling, helping them learn English is one of the best gifts we can give them.

ACCELERATED ENGLISH LEARNING PROJECT



In collaboration with Kyitsel-ling, we started the Accelerated English Learning Project at the local school at Clement Town - the Tibetan Nehru Memorial Foundation School. Some of the strategies to successfully implement this project include:

- Hiring a specialized teacher and increasing the amount of time allocated to the study of English
- Making available fun and colorful reading material in English
- Using internet resources and bringing key education technologies into the classrooms
- Devising strategies and learning activities aimed at putting miles on the tongue
- Consulting experts in the field

The school has already purchased a good collection of books for this project, and they've also recent hired a special teacher.

If this project is successful at Clement Town, we hope to reach out to other Tibetan schools. As far as educational projects go, this may be the niche where TCEF can contribute greatly to Tibetan education in exile.



NEW SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM IN NEPAL



Several of Bhime Sherpa's (our initial contact in this area) own children were sponsored children at Kyitselling. He saw first hand how education changed the lives of his children and family. He reached out to TCEF to help truly deserving children from humble homes in the tribal areas of Nepal.

Board member Alan Davis, and his wife Karen Cooper, another longtime sponsor traveled there to assess the situation and see the needs first hand.

From their report, the children truly deserve our help.

We've made a small beginning with five sponsorships. In the years ahead we hope to help more children from this region.




PUSH FOR MORE COLLEGE SPONSORSHIPS

At TCEF, we continue to ask these questions: With the changing times, what are some real needs of Tibetan education in exile? Where can we make a difference for them? This winter, we've had multiple conversations with our partners in India asking these very same questions.

The Tibetan population in the subcontinent is steadily decreasing due to interesting socio-economic trends and factors. Thanks to the efforts of HH The Dalai Lama and the early Tibetan leadership in exile, we have a good school infrastructure. In fact, at this time we may have more schools than we need! But, every year, hundreds of Tibetan students graduate from the Tibetan schools in exile. A high percentage of these students cherish hopes for a college education. We believe this is an excellent trend that can help them land good jobs in the Tibetan communities or even in the larger Indian job market. We think that helping needy and deserving Tibetan students access college education is worthwhile. In the years ahead we'd like to focus on and push for more college sponsorships.


