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SECTION 2: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

We are delighted to present this Project Completion Report for the Kyitsel-ling Tablets Project, made possible through the generous support of the Tibetan Children's Education Foundation (TCEF), USA, and all valued sponsors and friends.

This project involved the procurement and deployment of 25 Lenovo Idea Tab tablets and 25 earbuds for Kyitsel-ling's 76 children. The tablets have been successfully integrated into a structured Evening English Improvement Session and are also supporting online learning continuity and board exam preparation for senior students.

Student response has been overwhelmingly enthusiastic. The programme is already showing meaningful results in engagement and English language development — and the photographs in this report capture that joy beautifully.

SECTION 3: BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT

Kyitsel-ling has provided a safe, nurturing home for orphaned, semi-orphaned, and destitute Tibetan refugee children since 1997. Our 76 children attend TNMF School for formal CBSE education and return to Kyitsel-ling for evening study and development.

English language proficiency is critical for these children's long-term academic success. Many come with limited English exposure before joining Kyitsel-ling. Structured, technology-enabled English learning was therefore identified as a high-priority need — and this project was conceived to address it directly.

SECTION 5: PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION — EVENING ENGLISH SESSIONS

Following distribution, Kyitsel-ling launched a structured Evening English Improvement Session every Monday–Friday, 8:30 PM–9:15 PM, immediately after evening study, divided by age group:



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5.1. Junior Section (LKG – Class V)

Children watch English-language cartoons with subtitles to build listening comprehension and vocabulary in a fun, age-appropriate way. Supervised by Kyitsel-ling staff and Kyitsel-ling captains.

5.2. Middle Section (Class VI – VIII, ~24 students)

Students use tablets for guided English learning through educational apps, animated videos, and digital exercises. Supervised by Kyitsel-ling staff and Kyitsel-ling captains.

5.3. Senior Section (Class 9 – 12)

Senior students engage in group English conversation practice through interactive games — building spoken fluency directly relevant to CBSE board examinations.

The children genuinely look forward to this session every evening and participate with great enthusiasm and joy.

SECTION 6: ADDITIONAL BENEFITS

- Learning continuity during weather-related school closures — education continues uninterrupted via tablets online.
- Class 10 & 12 students supplementing CBSE board exam subjects through YouTube and educational platforms.
- Building digital literacy and long-term confidence with technology for all 80 children.

English Listening & Comprehension	Children watching English cartoons and 'Slow English' story videos to build vocabulary and listening skills daily.
Guided Digital Learning	Middle section (~24 students) engaged nightly in structured English learning through apps and animated content.
Spoken English Fluency	Senior students practising conversation through interactive games — building confidence for CBSE boards.
Learning Continuity	Uninterrupted education during weather-related school closures via tablets.
Board Exam Preparation	Class 10 & 12 using YouTube and educational platforms for subject revision.
Digital Literacy	All 76 children gaining daily confidence with digital technology.
Student Engagement	Overwhelmingly positive — the evening session is a highlight of every school day.
